Fund Commentary

The U.S. economy remained resilient this quarter, as strong consumer spending and an Al-driven capex boom offset labor market softness, tariff impact uncertainty, and sticky inflation. Job growth slowed sharply, however, with hiring plans at multi-year lows, prompting the Federal Reserve to cut rates in September and signal further easing ahead. In markets, global equities extended their rally and were led by the U.S. this quarter, most notably technology and Al names, as growth outpaced value broadly once again.

The Equity Series (the Series) posted positive absolute returns but underperformed its benchmark, the MSCI USA Investable Market Index. Sector positioning was a modest drag, but the majority of underperformance can be attributed to individual security selection.

While our limited participation in more speculative areas of the AI trade (e.g., Oracle, Broadcom, Palantir) and select "Magnificent 7" names (underweight NVIDIA; no exposure to Apple or Tesla) has remained a headwind, recent performance also reflects weakness in portfolio holdings the market views as candidates for disruption by AI. This includes leading software companies such as ServiceNow and Salesforce, where concerns over lower barriers to entry and reduced demand from enterprises building their own tools have pressured valuations. We believe these worries are overstated, as these businesses continue to generate resilient double-digit earnings growth and should remain successful in a changing technological landscape. On the positive side, positions in L3Harris Technologies, UnitedHealth Group, and Cadence Design Systems (an AI beneficiary) were notable contributors during the quarter.

In terms of portfolio positioning, we increased our exposure to Health Care, focusing on attractive valuation opportunities through the lens of our Bankable Deal strategy. The sector continues to face regulatory and policy uncertainty — including potential pharma tariffs, shifts in NIH and CDC funding, and changes in agency leadership — which has kept valuations near historic lows despite resilient earnings growth. In contrast, we exited our remaining railroad holdings. Despite occasional signs of improvement, volume growth and margin expansion have been inconsistent amid a prolonged industrial slowdown, and we decided to reallocate funds to more compelling opportunities.

Broadly speaking, stock valuations remain elevated by historical standards, though they are largely supported by companies continuing to deliver healthy earnings growth, and are not homogenous across the market. We believe the risks to economic growth and inflation are relatively balanced, and therefore not suggestive of significant portfolio biases from a top-down perspective. Rather, given the dispersion in valuation across different cohorts, the market appears ripe for high-conviction, bottom-up stock picking. As an experienced investment manager, we are well-versed in navigating shifting markets and believe active management remains essential to balancing the pursuit of risk and reward.

Definitions

Alpha: A measure of an investment's performance relative to a benchmark index. It represents the excess return of an investment compared to the return of the benchmark.

Beta: A measure of an investment's volatility relative to the overall market.

Standard Deviation: A statistical measure of the dispersion of returns for a given investment. It quantifies the amount of variation or volatility from the average return. Sharpe Ratio: A measure of risk-adjusted return, calculated by subtracting the risk-free rate from the investment's return and then dividing by its standard deviation.
